Teaching the Teachers

For the third year running, CAI-Gilgit held its teacher-training program in January, during the winter school break. Ninetythree teachers, most of whom had traveled great distances in winter from their remote mountain villages, participated in the 17day training.

A team of 10 master trainers helped organize the program and coursework.



Throughout the course trainers underscored the importance of lesson planning, classroom management, homework, feedback, and assessing students' progress. Teachers were encouraged to abandon old-fashioned rote lessons, understand each child's learning needs, and adapt teaching methods and styles to suit.

"Being a teacher, it is our duty to know and explore the potential of our students and point them in the right direction," said physics-subject trainer Fida Muhammad. "We are here to work for the welfare of the people. We the teachers are part of those who work for humanity."

CAI-Gilgit's teacher-training program continues to grow and attract new participants each year.
